FRAUD TIDBITS

I know we talk about this topic a lot, but identity theft continues to grow. Unfortunately, scammers are good at what they do. The best advice we can give you is to protect yourself. Here are a few ways to help keep your personal information and identity safe.

At home:

- Shred papers that have personal or medical information.

- Do not click on a link without considering the risks and knowing the source.

How will you know if someone steals your identity? Read your bills and account statements. Watch for:

- Things you did not buy.
- Items bought in places you have not been or from companies you do not recognize.
- Withdrawals from your account or transactions on your debit card that you did not make.
- A change of address you did not expect.
- Charges on medical statements that you don't recognize.
- Bills stop coming.
- Order a credit report once a year for free and review it carefully. Look for mistakes or accounts you do not recognize.
